

Jersey's Future Border & Immigration System

The Jersey Customs & Immigration Service is publishing a consultation document to gather feedback on how a similar system in Jersey would affect the Island and allow local Immigration policies to be appropriately adapted to meet the needs of the local business community and simultaneously maintain the Island's security. The crux of the policy intent is the ending of EU free movement, therefore introducing the need for a visa for all non-British and non-Irish citizens who wish to come to Jersey to work after 31st December 2020 and for employers to acquire an immigration work permit. This then puts into perspective the need for those EU citizens currently resident in Jersey to acquire settled status, allowing them to continue to live and work in Jersey after 2020, as they do now.
